Pingat Jasa Malaysia - Eligibility and Acceptance

I write to enquire regarding the eligibility for the Pingat Jasa Malaysia (PJM) by Gurkha soldiers who served with the British Army and also by members of the Malaysian Army and/or Malaysian citizens who enlisted in the British Army and were, I understand, known formally as "Locally Enlisted Personnel" (LEP). I was very fortunate to have served with members of both groups in Malaysia and some, being unable to correspond themselves, have asked me to pose the following questions:

1. Gurkhas - Non-British Citizens

- a. If not British citizens, e.g. citizens of Nepal, are Gurkhas eligible to apply for the PJM and, if so, through whom should they submit an application?
- b. Has the PJM been offered to them via either the Government of Nepal or the UK?
- c. If they are able to apply, are the eligibility criteria the same as for Australian/New Zealand citizens, or the same as for British citizens (the criteria, not yet officially confirmed in the latter case, appear to be different)?

2. Malaysian Citizens

- a. Are Malaysian citizens who enlisted in the British Army (e.g. LEP) eligible for the PJM?
- b. If so, through whom should they submit their application?
- c. If not, is there an equivalent Malaysian medal for Malaysian citizens they can apply for?
