Pingat Jasa Malaysia

Thank you for your response to my letter of the 17th of July 2006 and the enclosed reply from Mr. Ian McCartney, Minister for Trade, Investment and Foreign Affairs.

Sadly his reply only continues to state a case, which we believe, is fatally flawed and contrary to any sense of natural justice.

The Fight4thePJM committee, the representative group presenting the case on behalf of 35,000 Veterans who are eligible to receive the Pingat Jasa Malaysia award, so graciously offered by the Agong, Government and People of Malaysia, presented a Petition and Statement of Rebuttal on the 21st of June with an update on the 6th of September. I understand this is currently with Margaret Beckett for consideration. I have taken the liberty of including the links (*) to these statements in my e-mail and urge that you find time in your busy schedule to read them. They outline our case in great detail.

There is considerable and increasing support now within Westminster from people who have considered our case and accepted the undoubted merit of it.

I would be most grateful if I might count on your support in the matter of having this decision rescinded.
